Columbia Area and Shuttle Bus Tour Information

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Shown below is a bit of information about various sites you may find interesting to visit. Many of these sites are scheduled to be on the planned shuttle bus trips. Register and pay for tickets at the Women's Program/Tours Desk.

City of Columbia Activity & Recreation Center (The ARC) – 1701 W Ash, 874-7700 (Not on shuttle bus)

Open daily, 5:30 a-9:30 p. Daily passes are \$5/adult; \$3/children and seniors. This facility has exercise equipment and an indoor pool. Recreational swim times are: M,W,F/12noon-9:00 pm; Tues,Thurs/12noon-5:30 pm; Sat,Sun/12noon-7:30 pm. Stop at the front desk to pay for your daily pass. Canteen snacks are available. If you need to leave for a meal, stop at the front desk for a wrist band. Children must have an adult with them.

Artichoke Annie's Antique Mall – 1781 Lindberg Dr (9 mi east of Columbia/Millersburg Exit, not on shuttle bus), 573-474-2056

Open daily, 8a-8p. They have 184 dealers, and over 200 booths/showcases. They also have a "No Purse Rule," but 18 lockers are provided. They offer coffee and cookies, with soda for sale, but there is no food on site or in the shopping plaza.

Boone County Historical Society Museum – 3801 Ponderosa St. 573-443-8936

Open daily, 8:30a-4p. No entry fee to the History Museum and Art Gallery (about 45 minutes); \$2.00 entry fee to Boone Junction, which has an 1880 farm house, an 1820 cabin, and an 1890 store to visit (about 1-1/2 hour). Those who wish, may bring their lunch and eat on the veranda. A group of visitors might also want to call Buckingham's BBQ (573-499-1490) for a sandwich or salad delivery, to eat on the veranda.

Bradford Rose Garden – a University of Missouri site, 4968 Rangeline Road, 573-884-7945

Open for us, Friday, 10a-3p. This site is a virtual research site under the sun; they have a rose garden, several native gardens, and three rain gardens. The tour may take 1-1/2 hour to complete. Those who will be there through lunch time may wish to pre-pay **\$8/each** (at the tour desk) for a box lunch (from Jack's Gourmet restaurant). Box lunch choices are: 1) turkey, 2) ham OR 3) beef sandwich, potato chips, apple, cookie, OR 4) chicken salad sandwich, pasta salad, fruit salad, brownie, plus a diet or regular Coke or Sprite.

Fulton/Jefferson City – If 40 people register for this trip, a bus will take you to the historical sites shown below (not on shuttle bus) - **\$50/each**

Attendees will board a bus, at 9:00 am, at Boone County Fairgrounds, for ride to Fulton, MO – In Fulton they will tour the *Winston Churchill Memorial*, where Prime Minister Churchill made his famous "Iron Curtain Speech," and the *Wren Church*, which was the church Prime Minister Churchill attended. The church was shipped to Fulton brick by brick, and rebuilt at the memorial site. At 11:00 am, board bus for ride to Jefferson City, MO. Plans are to stop at *Ryan's Cafeteria* for an 11:30 am buffet luncheon. After lunch, the group will again board the bus for a guided tour of the historic Missouri State Capitol, which includes a museum and the famous Thomas Hart Benton mural. Plans can also be made to tour the *Missouri Governor's Mansion*, the *Mel Carnahan Gardens*, and the *Cole County Historical Society*. While in this area, attendees might also want to visit the Jefferson Landing State Historic Site. At this site you will find the *Lohman Building*, which was built in the late 1830s, and the *Union Hotel*, which houses art exhibits at the Elizabeth Rosier Gallery. At 3:45 pm, we board the bus and ride to Central Dairy, for a quick ice cream cone/treat before the return to Boone County Fairgrounds. Cost includes lunch, tour fees, tax, gratuity, and round-trip bus ride from/to the fairgrounds.

The Market Place (Antique Mall) – 1100 Business Loop 70W – 573-443-1970

Open Mon-Sat, 10a-7p. They have over 30,000 sq ft of space, with 200 different vendors, along with an outside courtyard area. In addition to this, they have a nice tea room (open 11-4 Tues-Sat). The tea room provides sandwiches, soup, and salads.

Museum of Anthropology, Swallow Hall, University of Missouri, 573-882-3573

Open Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri, 9a-4p; Weds, 9a-7p. No entry fee. There is a driveway between Jesse Hall and the museum, where a bus can turn around. There are two doors going into the building; the door on the right is the accessible entrance, where you enter main part of the museum.

Museum of Art & Archaeology, Pickard Hall, University of Missouri, 573-882-3591

Open Tues-Fri, 9a-4p. No entry fee. You may wish to enter through the accessible entrance, located on 9th Street side of building, by going down the ramp to the building. Once inside (the basement), use elevator to go to main museum, located on the 2nd floor, or the sculpture gallery, on the first floor.

Shelter Gardens, 1817 W. Broadway, 573-445-8441

Open daily; no entry fee. This is a five-acre garden, with more than 300 varieties of trees/shrubs, and over 10,000 of perennials and annuals. A replica of a one-room schoolhouse, a garden for the visually impaired, and a waterfall and stream are among the things at this site. On Sunday evenings, in June and July, they offer Concerts in the Gardens – around 6 pm, take a blanket or folding chair/s, a snack, and a soft drink to the park, and enjoy watching people and a free concert – music may be rock n roll, blues, or country. (Note: your hotel bus might take you to this spot.)

The YouZeum, 608 E. Cherry Street, 573-886-2006

Open Mon-Sat, 10a-5p; Sun, 1-5p. Entry fee: Adults/\$8, Ages 4-13/\$5, Age 3 and under/free. An interesting stop for both children and adults, the YouZeum is an interactive science center that focuses on the inter-workings of the human body.
